Lesson 10 tells of Paul's second missionary journey throughout what is today known as the Mediterranean Region. On our Bible maps, many of the areas in which Paul travels on this trip, are located near "The Great Sea" and the Aegean Sea. On a world map, the Great Sea is the Mediterranean Sea.

Due to a disagreement between Paul and Barnabas, they do not travel together this time, but each chooses another companion and they go to different places. Barnabas, with John Mark, returns to the churches of Cyprus. Paul chooses Silas and begins a journey in which they acquire another companion, are imprisoned, and meet people who have never heard the Gospel. Throughout all of their travels, God protects Paul and his companions while the churches continue to grow.

The Second Journey

Concept development: Salvation – Requiring five steps

Body:

- Lystra** Paul met Timothy (his mother a Jew and father a Greek)
Paul had Timothy circumcised because of the Jews in the area
They read the letter from the elders in Jerusalem and the apostles, at every place
The Churches were strengthened in the faith and increased in number daily
- Galatia** Paul was forbidden to speak the Word in Asia
- Troas** Paul had a vision of a man from Macedonia praying that they would come and help them
- Philippi** On the Sabbath they went to the place of prayer and talked to the women that had come together
Lydia a seller of purple heard the word, believed and was baptized, they stayed in her house
As they were going to the house of prayer a damsel possessed with an evil spirit followed them
These men are servants of the Most High God
They will show us the way of salvation
Paul grew weary of this and cast the evil spirit out in the name of Jesus
Her masters' saw that their profits were gone took Paul & Silas before their rulers
They accused them of action against Rome
They beat them and put them in the inner prison and bound their feet in stocks
At midnight Paul & Silas were praying and singing hymns
An earthquake opened the cell doors and loosed the stocks on all of the prisoners
The jailor seeing this was ready to kill himself until Paul told him that they were all there
He ran to Paul falling on his knees
Taking them out of the cell he ask, "What must I do to be saved?"
Paul told him to believe on the Lord Jesus and thou shall be saved
Paul preached unto him and those in his house and they were baptized
That morning the rulers sent messengers to let Paul and Silas go
Paul made the rulers come and send him away (more public)
Paul went to Lydia house and comforted the brethren and then departed
- Thessalonica** Paul went to the synagogue for three Sabbaths to reason with the Jews from the scriptures
That the Christ must suffer, to rise from the dead and this Jesus is the Christ
Some believed and help them teach
A great multitude of the devout Greeks and the chief women
The Jews that did not believe were envious
They took lewd fellows and stirred up the city and assaulted the house of Jason looking for Paul
They brought Jason and certain brethren unto the rulers
They turned the world upside down with their preaching
They do all things against Caesar and Jesus is their king and not Caesar
They were released and then left the city
- Berea** Paul went to the synagogue of the Jews
They received the word with readiness of mind and searched the scriptures daily
Many believed of the Greeks and honorable women
The Jews from Thessalonica came and stirred up the people of the city
Paul left the city (Silas and Timothy joined latter)

Athens Paul's spirit stirred because the city was wholly taken by idols
Paul went to the synagogue to teach the Jews and devoted men -devout
He also went to the market place with them that met with him
Philosophers of the Epicurean & Stoic want to hear what Paul was preaching
Paul preached unto them of the unknown god they had worshipped
Made all things, gave life and breath to all things
He appointed all men that they should seek Him
We are His offspring
All men should repent because there will be a day of judgment
God gave proof of that by raising Jesus from the dead
Some mocked and some said we will hear you again and some believed

Corinth Aquila & Priscilla had been sent out of Rome by Claudius and came to Corinth Jews were Cast out.
Paul stayed with them because they also made tents
Paul reasoned in the synagogue every week and persuaded both Jew and Greek
Some of the Jews rejected the gospel and blasphemed against God
Paul then began to preach to the Gentiles
Paul entered into the house of Iustus that joined to the synagogue
Crispus, chief ruler of the synagogue, with many others believed on the Lord
The Lord spoke to Paul and told him not to be afraid but to speak boldly in the city
Paul stayed there 1 1/2 years
The Jews brought Paul before Gallio, who dismissed the case

Ephesus Aquila and Priscilla went with Paul and stayed in Ephesus
Paul preached in the synagogue to the Jews
He departed unto Antioch End of 2nd Journey
